Say No to Drinking and Driving: Enjoy the Super Bowl at Home This Year

Marin County, Calif. – Whether it's the commercials, halftime show or the game itself, the Super Bowl is one of America's favorite entertainment highlights each year. The Marin County District Attorney's Office is reminding the community that everyone is on the same team when it comes to being safe on Super Bowl Sunday.

Super Bowl LV is Sunday, February 7, and Marin County law enforcement agencies will have additional officers on patrol over the Super Bowl weekend looking for drivers suspected of being under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.

"If you are watching the game at home and plan to have a drink or two, please stay at home," District Attorney Lori E. Frugoli said. "Have a family member who hasn't been drinking go out on your behalf or have your food delivered."

The Marin County District Attorney's Office reminds the public that alcohol is not the only thing that impairs and may lead to a DUI. Prescription drugs, over-the-counter medications and marijuana may affect your ability to drive safely. Do your research and understand how a drug affects you before deciding whether or not you are OK to drive.

California's public health guidance advises to limit mixing with people you don't live with as much as possible to limit the spread of COVID-19. Although many watch parties will be virtual this year, it's important to plan ahead, designate a sober driver or simply stay at home for the night.
